Questions

- 1. (a) The framework used to record and summarize the economic activities of a business enterprise is referred to as the accounting equation. State the basic accounting equation and define its major components. How are business transactions and financial statements related to the accounting equation?
 - (b) At the beginning of the year, Yates Company had total assets of \$550,000 and total liabilities of \$200,000. Answer the following questions viewing each situation as being independent of the others.
 - (i) If total assets increased \$200,000 during the year, and total liabilities decreased \$75,000, what is the amount of owner's equity at the end of the year?
 - (ii) During the year, total liabilities increased \$230,000 and owner's equity decreased \$90,000. What is the amount of total assets at the end of the year?
 - (iii) If total assets decreased \$40,000 and owner's equity increased \$130,000 during the year, what is the amount of total liabilities at the end of the year?
- 2. Consider the following transactional data for the first month of operations for Crystal Clear Cleaning.
- Nov. 1 Aaron Hideaway contributed \$15,000 and a truck, with a market value of \$3,000, to the business in exchange for capital.
 - The business paid \$4,000 to Pleasant Properties for November through February rent. (Debit Prepaid Rent)
 - Paid \$4,800 for a business insurance policy for the term November 1, 2018 through October 31, 2019. (Debit Prepaid Insurance)
 - 4 Purchased cleaning supplies on account, \$320.
 - 5 Purchased on account an industrial vacuum cleaner costing \$1,500. The invoice is payable November 25.
 - 7 Paid \$3,900 for a computer and printer.
 - 9 Performed cleaning services on account in the amount of \$4,700.
 - Received \$200 for services rendered on November 9.
 - Paid employees, \$400.
 - Received \$15,000 for a 1-year contract beginning November 16 for cleaning services to be

- provided. Contract begins November 16, 2018, and ends November 15, 2019. (Credit Unearned Revenue)
- 17 Provided cleaning services and received \$400 cash.
- Received a utility bill for \$175 with a due date of December 4, 2018. (Use Accounts Payable)
- Borrowed \$36,000 from bank with interest rate of 6% per year.
- Received \$500 on account for services performed on November 9.
- 25 Paid \$750 on account for vacuum cleaner purchased on November 5.
- 29 Paid \$200 for advertising.
- Hideaway withdrew cash of \$1,400 from the business.

Required:

- 1. Journalize the transactions, using the following accounts: Cash; Accounts Receivable; Cleaning Supplies; Prepaid Rent; Prepaid Insurance; Equipment; Truck; Accounts Payable; Unearned Revenue; Notes Payable; Hideaway, Capital; Hideaway, Withdrawals; Service Revenue; Salaries Expense; Advertising Expense; and Utilities Expense. Explanations are not required.
- 2. Open a T-account for each account.
- 3. Post the journal entries to the T-accounts, and calculate account balances.
- 4. Prepare a trial balance as of November 30, 2018.

Consider the following adjustment information data to complete the other requirements:

- a. Cleaning supplies on hand at the end of November were \$50.
- b. One month's combined depreciation on all depreciable assets was estimated to be \$150.
- c. One month's interest expense is \$59.

Required:

- 5. Using the data provided from the trial balance, the previous adjustment information, prepare all required adjusting journal entries at November 30.
- 6. Prepare an adjusted trial balance as of November 30 for Crystal Clear Cleaning.
- 7. Prepare a worksheet at November 30, 2018. Use the unadjusted trial balance prepared earlier.
- 8. Prepare an income statement and statement of owner's equity for the month ended November 30, 2018. Also prepare a classified balance sheet at November 30, 2018, using the report format. Assume the Notes Payable is long-term. Use the worksheet prepared in Requirement 1 or the adjusted trial balance from Chapter 3.
- 9. Prepare closing entries at November 30, 2018, and post to the accounts. Open T-accounts for Income Summary and Hideaway, Capital. Determine the ending balance in each account. Denote each closing amount as *Clos.* and each account balance as *Balance*.
- 10. Prepare a post-closing trial balance at November 30, 2018.

Advanced Airline expects the plane to be flown 1,100,000 miles the first year and 1,200,000 miles the second year.

The Padma Multipurpose Bridge is a dream project for millions of people in the southwestern region of Bangladesh. Prior to the opening of the bridge, these districts were cut off from the country's major economic center, the Dhaka-Chattogram economic corridor. Ferries, launches, and boats were the only means of communication and transport on the Padma River to the southwestern districts. This form of transport was not only uncertain but was also time-consuming. Due to poor connectivity, economic operations in the southwestern zone have not been too easy. Consequently, the districts did not seize much industrialization. As a result, poverty and under-employment constitute major problems in the region. However, it will connect the isolated 21 southwestern districts to the mainstream economy. It will also connect the port of Mongla and the port of Payra, respectively the second and third-largest ports in the country, with the capital. Enhanced connectivity will encourage investment in the region. Therefore, not only will the economy in the southwestern region prosper and create jobs, but the economy as a whole will grow. The Padma Multipurpose Bridge is estimated to boost the country's annual GDP by 1.23 percent. Similarly, the southwestern region's GDP is projected to increase by 2.5 percent.
